western North Carolina mountains. The reservoir in its entirety is located solely within Cherokee County. The dam was designed and built to generate hydroelectric energy during World War II. Adjacent to the Nantahala National Forest, the reservoir has very little private shoreline development and NO commercial recreation facilities. Apalachia is one of the most pristine lakes of unparalleled beauty offering fishing, canoeing, hiking and primitive camping recreation areas. Because of the remote location, relatively few anglers use the reservoir. Sport fish include smallmouth bass, spotted bass largemouth bass, redbreast sunfish and white bass.

# Did you know???

Construction of the Apalachia Dam began in 1941 and took 2 years to complete. The dam is 150 feet high and stretches 1,308 feet across the Hiwassee River. Apalachia is a relatively small reservoir with 31 miles of shoreline and

about 1,070 acres of water surface. Apalachia is a run-of-river reservoir, meaning that water is passed through the reservoir without being stored long-term. A public boat ramp is located below the Hiwassee Lake Dam at the TVA

Powerhouse. Fishing the shoreline is also accessed at this same location.

 Construction of Hiwassee Dam began in 1936 and took 4 years to complete. The dam is 307 feet high and stretches 1,376 feet across the Hiwassee River. You can easily locate the dam by entering 600 Powerhouse Road, Murphy, N.C.



Rivers in and near Cherokee County include the Hiwassee, Valley, Nottley, Ocoee and Nantahala. The Hiwassee River is approximately 147 miles long. Its headwaters are in North Georgia but it flows through Cherokee County turning westward to Tennessee, ultimately flowing into the Tennessee River. The Valley River begins as a pair of springs from within the Snowbird Mountains and flows southwest into the Hiwassee River. The town of Murphy is situated at the confluence of the Hiwassee and Valley Rivers. The rivers are a popular source of outdoor adventure, including white water rafting, kayaking, canoeing and fishing.

# Did you know???

· Cherokee County has few waterfalls because of our topography. Most waterflow starts small in the higher elevation and at the point the waterflow can become a waterfall the elevation is not steep enough to create a fall. North Shoal Creek, Leatherwood and Kennedy are small falls in our area but be careful because they all are near or on private property.

# Murphy River Walk - Murphy, NC Murphy River Walk is a wonderful 4 mile greenway that follows the Hiwassee Murphy NC. NEW 2018! - an exciting new addition to lengthen the River Walk. Cherokee County is a center for outdoor recreation because of our location. Cherokee County is located within Nantahala National Forest with the Chattahoochee

# National Forest and Great Smoky Mountain National Park close by.

Our public lands offer more than 245 miles of bike trails. In addition, forest roads are also open for mountain biking, unless otherwise signed. The Ramsey Bluff Bike Trail System is located at the Hanging Dog Campground area, and offers under-utilized adventure in mountain biking, hiking, and cross-country running. The eight mile labyrinth of trails is actually a group of connected loops, allowing an interesting variety of combinations for repeat visitors to explore. The trail difficulty ranges from easy to moderate, and range from 1500 to 1900' i elevation. The trail system has two good access points with parking: the Uppe Parking area above the Boat Launch, and Iceberg Hill on Ramsey Bluff Road. Restrooms are near the Boat Launch trailhead.

Outdoor Recreation

Piney Knob Trail System, 22.3 miles of recreational hiking and mountain biking trails on the 700+ acre Murphy Watershed property is off of Piney Knob Hill Road. All trails are dirt single-track trails and built in accordance with International Mountain Bike Association (IMBA) standards.

Cherokee County offers a plethora of camping options. Whether its tenting under the stars or tucked away in a luxury RV with all the amenities, this is the perfect camping destination. Carriage Hills Farm Equine Camping, Murphy/ Peace Valley KOA, Persimmon Creek Campground, Valley River RV Resort, and WagonMaster Adventure Ranch provide quality camping options. Hunting

Many game animals, including white-tailed deer, black bear, wild turkey, ruffed grouse and gray squirrel, thrive in the forest. The Forest Service provides a variety of hunting opportunities, including accessible hunting in the following areas. Where there are fields adjacent to or a short distance from the road: Perry Gap Road; Deep Gap Road; Fires Creek Road; Nelson Ridge Road; Tuni Gap Road; Beech Creek Road; Panther Top Road; Powerline Cove Road; Copper Creek Road; and Davis Creek Road. Parking is available in wide areas along the roads.

Our public lands are a haven for fishing. Cold water, mountain streams are prime habitat for brown, rainbow and native brook trout. All national forest streams are "wild trout waters," unless classified and posted otherwise. With several trout streams, Cherokee County has become a popular place for fly fishing. Trout fishing season lasts from April - February, which makes it a great activity for almost any time of the year. For the angler looking for spotted bass, striped bass, hybrids, walleye, crappie, catfish, bluegill, large or smallmouth bass Lake Hiwassee, Lake Cherokee, or Appalachia Lake offer those varieties. If you need gear, visit Shook's Marina, Duke's Hideaway or Mountain View Marina to rent a boat or utilize a guide service like Big ol' Fish Guide Service or Apalachia Lake

## **Whitewater Sports**

With two world class rivers within a few miles of Cherokee County, rafting, canoeing or kayaking is a great family activity. The Ocoee River - just across the border in Tennessee with class III to IV rapids - played host to the 1996 Summer Olympics and boasts a number of professional rafting companies. For a slightly slower pace try the Nantahala River to the north of Cherokee County. This class II and III river is family friendly with self-guided rafts and kayaks available for rent. Of course the Nottely River, the Hiwassee River and Valley River along with many lesser tributaries are available for canoeing, boating or tubing. If you need equipment or prefer a guide, try using Carolina Outfitters, Rolling Thunder River Company Nantahala Outdoor Center or Carolina Ocoee.

Cherokee County was formed in 1839 from a portion of Macon County, but Murphy wasn't incorporated as the county seat until 1851.

Murphy was once the terminus of the two train lines. The Mineral Bluff, GA spur line (L&N Railroad) came out of North GA and the Murphy Branch (Southern Railroad) came from Asheville. The L&N line was removed in the mid-1980s. The tracks for the Murphy Branch remain but are inoperable. It has been idle since the mid-1990s when the Great Smoky Mountain Railroad discontinued service between Murphy and Andrews. The L&N Depot remains as a community center just southwest of downtown Murphy. Murphy was the home of the once well-known crafts manufacturer Margaret Studios, which operated a nationwide chain of gift stores for its woodcraft products and housewares, such as lazy Susans and gift trays.

Folklorist John Jacob Niles based his well-known Christmas song "I Wonder as I Wander" on a phrase he heard in a song sung by the young daughter of a group of traveling evangelists in downtown Murphy on July

Architect James Baldwin designed the Cherokee County Courthouse, located in downtown Murphy, in a Beaux-Arts style. Built in 1927, it is faced with locally sourced blue marble and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places along with the Robert Lafayette Cooper House and Harshaw Chapel and Cemetery.


The 466-square-mile county encompasses 300,100 acres, with 92.363 of that U.S. Forest Service land.

- North Carolina does have a state income tax.




